STATING THAT the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) was "moving in the right direction" by vacci-nating one-fourth of the total registered people who are either bedridden or immobile, the Bombay High Court on Thursday

Bombay High Court on Thursday asked other civic bodies in Maharashtra to follow BMCs model to initiate similar drives. On Tuesday, the BMC had in-formed the court that between July 30 and August 9, of the 4,889 registered beneficiaries, 1,317 people have been inoculated against Covid-19. "This figure constitutes muchly 25 per cent constitutes roughly 25 per cent of total registered beneficiaries. Encouraging part is that none of the persons vaccinated had any adverse effects. We record our satisfaction that the BMC has been moving in the right directo cover more such individuals in the days to come," the bench

noted.

On August 10, the civic body had submitted an affidavit to a division bench of Chief Justice Dipankar Datta and Justice Girish S Kulkarni, which has been hearing a PIL filed by city-based lawyers Dhruti Kapadia and Kunal Tiwari seeking directions to the Control bustons. and Kunal Tiwari seeking direc-tions to the Centre, the state and the BMC to provide door-to-door vaccination to people aged above 75, the disabled and the bedridden. ORSERVING THAT there will be chaos if a proper policy on vehi-cle parking is not formulated, the Bombay High Court on Thursday said that authorities should not allow families owning only one flat to have four or five cars if

Maintaining that it expected the state to ensure that new and planned cities do not face issues due to illegal "on-street parking", it asked the Navi Mumbai plan-ning authorities to be more alive to problems of traffic consession ning authorities to be more alive to problems of traffic congestion being faced by the people of Mumbai due to roadside parking. The court said that BMC's decision to fine people RS 10,000 for parking on the road despite the presence of a parking slot nearby has to be strictly implemented.

According to the Mumbai Police, 42,7025 peo-ple have been fined Rs 200 since February 19. Crime Branch officials and detection staff have beer exempted from wearing police uniform while on duty as their job

uniform while on duty as their job demands secrety.

The order read, "It has been observed that several police officers and constable take action in civil clothes. Taking advantage of which several criminals pose as police officials and under the pre-text offining people, steal money from senior citizens and women."

Nagrale has said that if any ice personnel is found penalising violators in civil clothes, then action will be taken against them and the police inspectors in charge of that department.

Grants 30 more days to investigation agency to file chargesheet

A special National Investigation Agency (NIA) court, while giving its nod for 30 more days' time last week to file the chargesheet in the case related to the bomb scare outside industrialist Mukesh Ambani's residence and the murder of businessman Mansukh Hiran, has said in a detailed order that it considered the seriousness of allegations and depth of probe while doing so.

Special judge Prashant R Sitre said in his order, "Considering the facts and circumstances of the case, the seriousness of allegations as to the criminal conspiracy, the depth of investigation, upon consideration of the report minutely, I am of the

firm view that the learned public prosecutor has considered the progress in the investigation and the part of the investigation that is yet to be completed in proper perspective and that after applying mind independently he has submitted the report."

The court said that in view of the matter, it would be just to extend detention of the accused and grant time for investigation for a period of 30

more days. This is the second time the court has extended time for filing the chargesheet, after having given 60-day exten-

The court further said in its order that it has perused the case diary that has been placed on record and is satisfied that the reasons cited by the prosecutor for the extension of detention are sound and are based on material that are placed before him by the investigating agency.

The NIA had sought extension of time by citing that sanction was required under a provision of the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act to prosecute the accused and without this, the court could not take cognizance of the of-

It had submitted that time would be required to collect relevant documents, forward the proposal for sanction and to obtain it. The agency had further said that the data was voluminous and that the larger conspiracy is spread over several parts of Maharashtra and that the NIA team has to visit scenes of crime on several occasions as part of the

slum dwellers. "We have issued notices to more than 300 owners, who have illegal extensions of

their slums. We will demolish the structure if they don't do it by themselves. In the past one week, we have demolished seven of such structures," said Mahendra Ubale, assistant municipal commissioner and in-charge

of ME ward. Ubale has said that the BMC is identifying illegal structures and reaching out to their owners and by the end of this month, they plan "We cannot say how many

structures will be demolished as we have not set any target. We are in the process of serving notices to the slums and demolishing on our own, if they fail to do so,' said Ubale.

Another senior civic official requesting anonymity said that after notices were served on the residents, many of them responded and sought the BMC's help to raze the illegal parts of the struc-

"We are only bringing down the portions that are illegal, often the slum dwellers don't have the manpower and logistics to demolish them. So they approach us," said the

Local Samajwadi Party legislator Abu Azmi supported the move and said that illegal residents would not be given any kind of alternate rehabilitation."Those who extend their properties do it illegally and this is a threat to people living there. The BMC is demolishing all the properties that were illegal and those who have constructed those structures, will not be given any kind of compensation,' Azmi told FPJ on Thursday.

Sarfaraz Ahmed, a local social worker, said that the BMC should bring a permanent solution to the illegal construction, so that more lives could be saved.

returned it immediately. Later, Vikas asked the boy to pay Rs 5,000 and the teenager, who was unaware of the fraud, transferred the money. This time, Vikas did not return him anything and continued to demand more money. Soon, Vikas asked the boy to share the OTP received on his mother's mobile phone and as the victim shared the OTP, Rs 1 lakh had been

For the next two days, Vikas continued to ask for the OTP numbers which the boy had shared, said police. When the teenager asked to return the money, Vikas stopped entertaining his calls. Recently when the teenager's father updated his passbook he was shocked to see the transactions of Rs 4.07 lakh. When he asked his son about it, he narrated the entire story, said police. - Sachin Gaad

Court: Sex that led to paralysis 'unfortunate', can't say illegal

Sessions court grants pre-arrest bail to husband in dowry harassment case where woman alleged marital rape led to paralysis

A sessions court has granted pre-arrest bail to a man and four members of his family in a dowry harassment case, in which the wife had also alleged forcible sex that led to waist-down paralysis. The court observed that while the young girl suffering paralysis was unfortunate, being her husband the man cannot be said to have committed anything illegal.

Additional sessions judge Sanjashree J Gharat stated in her order, "It is the further grievance of the complainant that the husband committed

IPC reads that sexual intercourse or sexual acts of a man with his own wife, the wife not being below 15 years of age, is not rape.

An exception to the offence of rape under the

sexual intercourse with her against her wish." The court went on to say, "However, it cannot be said that he committed any illegal thing." An exception to the offence of rape under the Indian Penal

Code reads that sexual inter-

course or sexual acts of a man

with his own wife, the wife not being below 15 years of age, is Thus, marital rape is still not a crime in India. The court called it "very unfortunate" that the young girl suffered from paralysis.

It said that the man and his parents cannot be held responsible for this. The woman, who got married in November last year, had complained that one month after marriage her husband had started committing forcible sexual intercourse. In January, after an intercourse,

she had started feeling unwell. When she went to a doctor, she was informed that she had suffered paralysis below her

In her complaint, the woman alleged that her in-laws put restrictions on her, taunted, abused and demanded dowry. The husband and his family claimed protection from arrest, stating they had been falsely implicated and that they had not demanded dowry. The court remarked on this aspect that while the woman had claimed that she was mistreated by the family for not paying dowry, she had not specified what was the demand made by

Two dupe elderly women of Rs 15K by posing as BMC employees The Kandivali police arrested a

person for allegedly duping an elderly woman of Rs 15,000 by posing as Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC) officials. The police launched a search for his accomplice and registered an offence against the duo based on the complaint. The accused duo, who work at a toll collection plaza, reportedly told the victim, a resident of Mahavir Nagar in Kandivali (W), that the renovation work that was going on in her flat was illegal. According to Kandivali Police sources, the complainant was renovating her house last month and the accused, identified as Avinash Gaikwad and Satish Tambat, approached her claiming to be the BMC officials. They allegedly told her that the renovation work was not given permission by the BMC and claimed that she was violating the rules. The police arrested Gaikwad while his accomplice Tambat is absconding. The duo also allegedly threatened to penalise her and later agreed to 'settle' the matter if she had paid them Rs 15,000, to which the woman complied.

A few days later, when she inquired at the BMC ward office, she learnt that no such employees were given the power to penalise unauthorised renovation and realised that she had been duped. - Staff Reporter
