BHIWANDI Man 'kills' neighbour for 'creating disturbance'

A MAN allegedly beat his neighbour to death for 'creating disturbance' while he was talking to his wife on the phone in Bhiwandi on Wednesday. The accused is on the run, police said.

According to sources, the incident occurred at Kailashnagar in Bhiwandi. "The accused, identified as Ashish Jaiswar was talking to his wife on phone. His neighbour, Sanjay Rathod was allegedly making a lot of noise, because of which he couldn't talk over the phone," said an officer.

Jaiswar allegedly asked Rathod to keep quiet, but when he did not listen, he took a wooden bat, used for washing clothes, and started beating Rathod. "Rathod collapsed after Jaiswar hit him multiple times on the head," said the officer.

After Rathod collapsed, Jaiswar ran away while Rathod was taken to a nearby hospital, where he was declared dead. "Rathod died due to the multiple head injuries he suffered. It is clear that Jaiswar inflicted those injuries. However, we are investigating further," the officer said. "We are yet to arrest Jaiswar," he added.

Both Rathod and Jaiswar used to work in a nearby factory, sources said.

BID TO MINIMISE INCIDENTS OF SIGNAL PASSING AT DANGER

At meet with kin of loco pilots, CR to stress on need for rest

WITH AT least four incidents of Signal Passing at Danger (SPAD) being reported in the last one month, the Central Railway (CR) will on Friday organise a meeting with the family members of loco pilots at Kalyan to advise them on allowing the staff to rest properly for smooth operation of train services. This is the third such session planned by the CR in the last two years in Mumbai.

Called SPAD in railway terminology, it means a motorman or a loco pilot has forgotten to halt the train at a stop signal. In suburban sections, signals are placed at a distance of 120 m on the tracks. Motormen are required to keep an

eye on each of the signals and accordingly increase or reduce the speed of trains. The CR employs at least 2,500 motormen, loco pilots and assistant loco pilots.

On May 18, a motorman of the Titwala-Karjat fast local had jumped a signal and was suspended. Similar incidents were reported at Kurla and Vidyavihar stations on May 14 and April 21, respectively. Moreover, an Andheri-bound train had over-shot platform at Nerul on May 23.

While 40 families of loco pilots have been called for the interaction in the first phase on Friday, the motormen's families would be invited in the second phase.

V Malegaonkar, Additional Divisional Railway Manager (CR) said, "The senior management of CR has planned a meeting to ap-

prise the family members of loco pilots and motormen about the importance of the rest. We will inform the families about the tasks that their husbands and heads of the families perform, which need 100 per cent concentration and dedication. This way they will understand the importance of rest and not disturb the loco pilots and motormen at home."

"We also ask the family members if they are facing any administrative problems, such as housing accommodation... They should inform and we will solve the matter," Malegaonkar added.

To reduce SPAD cases, the CR has counseled motormen about remaining calm while driving trains. At least 45 sessions to counsel motormen were conducted last year across the country.

2 booked after labourer dies in wall collapse

Mumbai: The Shivaji Nagar police on Wednesday registered a case of causing death due to negligence against a contractor and an owner of a dilapidated structure. One labourer died and another sustained injuries after a wall, a part of the structure, collapsed on Tuesday. No arrests have been made in the case yet.

Police Inspector Hasan Jathar said, "The structure was dilapidated and the labourers should have been provided safety gear. The contractor and house owner did not take any safety measure, thereby, endangering the labourers' lives." He added, "An FIR for causing death due to negligence has been registered against the contractor and owner."

On Tuesday, local residents Arjun Verma and Vijay Verma were working on an old 1+1 structure in the Gajanan Colony area of Shivaji Nagar. Around 5.30 pm, the wall on the ground floor fell on them. Local residents and police pulled them out of the rubble and had rushed them to the hospital. While Arjun succumbed to his injuries, Vijay had been recuperating at the hospital. **ENS**

Second round for admissions under RTE Act begins in city

Admissions were to be concluded after four rounds by end of April but so far only one round has been completed

WITH A fortnight to go before the schools re-open after summer vacations, the education department on Thursday opened the second round for admission to 25 per cent seats reserved in private schools for children from the economically weaker sections.

After adding new categories to allow HIV+ children, VJ & NT (Vimukta Jati and Nomadic tribes), OBCs (Other Backward Classes), and SBC (Special Backward Class) children to apply for free education under the Right to Education (RTE) Act, the education department will conduct admissions afresh. Parents, who missed out on the application process in the first round, can apply between May 24 and 31.

This year, the admission process has faced several hurdles. Though the admission process started in February this year, it is yet to be completed. The admissions were to be concluded after four rounds of lotteries by end of April but so far only one round has been completed.

In the first round there were 8,374 seats available for 10,660 applications. In the first round of lottery 3,239 candidates were allotted seats but only around 2,000 of them could be admitted. Many unaided schools had refused to

admit students as a mark of protest against the pending dues from the government for admitting students under the RTE quota.

The government tweaked the law to add more categories for eligibility in the RTE quota and the admission process was stalled yet again for almost a month.

A senior official of the education department of the Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation, which is conducting the RTE admissions, said, "The admission process has been delayed for reasons beyond our control. We have now been given five days for parents to apply. Once all applications are done, we will hold the lotteries."

Sudhir Paranjpe, an RTE activist, said students admitted to schools with ICSE, CBSE and other non-state boards will lose out on fees classes as the academic year has already started. "These children are from marginalised sections of the society. Losing out on classes will put them at a disadvantage," he said.

HC allows 25-week pregnant woman to undergo abortion

THE BOMBAY High Court on Thursday allowed a 25-year-old woman from Andheri to abort her 25-week foetus at Nanavati Hospital.

The woman in her petition had said it had been detected during a routine screening that the foetus suffered diaphragmatic hernia. After going through the MRI scan reports of the foetus, the doctor opined that the "foetal MRI indicate poor prognosis of survival and there is a chance that the baby may not survive after birth in spite of best efforts".

After receiving opinion from the doctor, the petitioner desired to terminate the pregnancy. The petitioner approached the court as section 3 of the Medical

Termination of Pregnancy Act, 1971, does not allow termination of pregnancy beyond 20 weeks.

On Monday, a vacation bench of Justice S J Kathawalla and Justice A S Gadkari had directed to constitute a Committee of Medical Board at Sir JJ Hospital, comprising hospital Dean and other experts in the field, including Head of the Department of Gynaecology, Neurology, Paediatrics, Psychology and Radiology. The medical board of expert doctors shall examine the women and submit the report.

Bank CEO loses Rs 2L in credit card fraud

THE CEO of a leading multinational bank lost Rs 2 lakh in a credit card fraud earlier this week.

A foreign national, the executive has been heading the India operations of the bank — which is headquartered in BKC — for nearly three years. Police said the fraud took place on Tuesday when the 49-year-old executive was in his hotel room.

According to police, even as the CEO had his credit card with him, he received a text message for a transaction of Rs 2 lakh towards purchase of medicines from a pharmacy.

Police said the executive immediately notified his bank of the fraudulent transaction, blocked his card and had his office lodge a complaint with the police.

Car showroom executive booked for duping firm, customers: Cops

THE WORLI police has registered a case of cheating against a sales executive of a car showroom for allegedly duping the company and customers over a period of time.

The accused, Sunny Dhotre (37), would allegedly take money from car buyers and put it in his own bank account. During the four months when Dhotre was employed at the showroom, he allegedly took money from 10 buyers.

Police said Dhotre had joined the showroom in December 2017. "As a sales executive, his job was to contact those interested in purchasing vehicles and take payments from them. Over a period of time, he dealt with 10 people who were interested in purchasing four-wheelers. In April, the manager at the showroom

got a call from one customer asking for the delivery of his vehicle. While as per records, he had not paid for the car, the customer insisted he had paid a cheque of Rs 2.5 lakh to Dhotre," an officer said.

When the manager of the showroom made further enquiries, he found that the customer had actually made a payment via cheque. "Dhotre had taken a blank cheque from the customer and deposited the same in his account. When the manager cross-checked with other customers, who had been coordinating with Dhotre, it was found that in 10 such cases, the accused had taken cheques in his name and deposited the same in his own account," said the officer.

Following this, the manager approached the local Worli police station, where an FIR was registered.

Senior Inspector Jitendra Pawar said, "So far no arrests have been made, as the investigation is at an early stage."

Nipah virus hits monsoon retreat to north Kerala

THERE HAS been an increase in the number of cancellations of trips to parts of Kerala in the past one week, data from travel websites indicates. The outbreak of Nipah virus in Kerala's Kozhikode district, in which at least 12 people have died, affected monsoon retreat to the state.

For its backwaters, Kerala remains a popular monsoon getaway for travellers from Mumbai. They also flock to the state to receive Ayurvedic treatment during this period.

According to travel websites, travellers are inquiring with the sites if it would be safe to visit the southern state.

Rajeev Kale, president & country head — Holidays, MICE, Visa & Passport Services, Thomas Cook (India) Ltd said, "According to updates received from our local partners, the Union Health Ministry

had sent a high-level, multi-disciplinary team to Kerala's Kozhikode district to probe into the Nipah virus cases and assess the overall situation. We confirm that while we do not have any customers booked to Kozhikode district, our tour operations team is in constant touch with our on-ground partners/suppliers and are closely monitoring the situation to implement preventives that may be required."

Manheer Singh Sethi, co-founder, Travkart said, "There has been a slowdown movement towards Kerala and travel segment has started taking the hit. We have witnessed a 20 per cent surge in demand for Kerala this season out

of which three to four per cent have opted for rescheduling due to impact of Nipah virus."

Many travellers are delaying their trips to Kerala. As northern part of the state remains most-affected, travellers want to explore other destinations in the state.

Aloke Bajpai, ixigo CEO & Co-founder said, "We have received quite a few queries from concerned travellers who are thinking of delaying their travel plans to Kerala. However, since the problem is confined to North Kerala, we have not observed any visible dip in future bookings or cancellations in the existing ones. We are making sure we keep travellers informed of any update."

Chembur resident Rahul Joshi, who often travels on business purpose to Kerala said, "As my trip does not involve going to Kozhikode, I will take a short trip this weekend to Kerala on business purpose. While I wanted to take my family along, I won't be doing so as it involves risk."
